

TPPC Pilot Checklist

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Workflow selection

- ☐ One workflow is already important enough that someone cares when it fails.
- ☐ The workflow has a clear owner and a clear release decision owner.
- ☐ The workflow is narrow enough to evaluate in 30 days.
- ☐ The workflow still relies on old systems, manual review, or repeated rework today.

Workflow economics

- ☐ The team can identify which step AI should own first.
- ☐ The team can estimate what delay, rewrite work, or approval drag already costs today.
- ☐ There is enough workflow context to compare the current state against a realistic pilot target.
- ☐ The workflow is painful enough that a 30-day pilot would matter commercially.

Evaluation readiness

- ☐ The team can define what pass/fail means for the workflow.
- ☐ There are representative inputs or traces to evaluate against.
- ☐ Promotion should require evidence, not just intuition.

Release and recovery

- ☐ Someone can approve or reject the workflow release decision.
- ☐ The team wants a clearer incident and rollback path if quality drops.
- ☐ The pilot will be judged on workflow proof, not vague prompt quality.

Do not book yet if

- You cannot point to one workflow that already hurts
- You want a general AI roadmap more than a pilot decision
- No workflow owner or sponsor can join the process
- You are unwilling to judge the pilot on time, rework, approvals, or rollback readiness
